\$2.00 / ton excise tax imposed on the disposal of solid waste into MSW or C&D landfills

§ 130A-295.8. Fees applicable to permits for solid waste management facilities

Fees credited to SW Management Account used to support the solid waste management program

"§ 105-187.63. Use of tax proceeds.

From the taxes received pursuant to this Article, the Secretary may retain the costs of collection, not to exceed **\$225,000** a year, as reimbursement to the Department. The Secretary shall credit or distribute taxes received, less the cost of collection, as follows:

- (1) **50% to the Inactive Hazardous Sites Cleanup Fund** established by G.S. 130A-310.11.
- (2) **37.5% to units of local government** that provide solid waste management services directly to residents within the political boundaries of the unit of local government as determined by DENR, distributed on a per capita basis as described in G.S. 105-472(b)(1). Funds distributed under this subdivision shall be used by a unit of local government solely for solid waste management programs and services.
- (3) **12.5% to the Solid Waste Management Trust Fund** established by G.S. 130A-309.12 "

Inactive Hazardous Sites Program

OVERVIEW

An organizational change within the Department of Environment and Natural Resources in February 2007 consolidated oversight of contaminated site remediation into the Division of Waste Management (DWM).

The Inactive Hazardous Sites Branch, within the Superfund Section of the DWM, is responsible for oversight and approval of the assessment and remediation of all hazardous sites and any recent accidental releases of hazardous substances and pollutants with the exceptions outlined below. The Branch oversees remedial actions, conducts any necessary enforcement of assessment and remediation at sites deemed to be a priority, and conducts the work itself at orphaned sites when state resources are available for such.

FUNDING

- Five quarterly deposits to the Inactive Hazardous Sites Cleanup Fund from March 2009 through February 2010 total \$10,905,428.15.
- Most of the available funds are designated to State contracts

- 2005 Hurricane Recovery Act contract was extended to complete location research and verification of old landfill sites not included in either 1999 or 2005 hurricane recovery act which includes 20 counties.
- Newly reported sites are also being addressed under this contract.
- Approximately \$170,000 in funding for the hurricane contract extension remains to complete location research and verification.
- Nine counties are in the final stages of location research and verification.
- The work in these remaining counties is expected to be completed by the end of April.
- This work will continue to be conducted as notification of newly discovered sites are received.

Inventory

- 664 landfill sites included in the pre-regulatory landfill inventory
- These pre-1983 landfill sites are being addressed by priority of eligible sites ranked in decreasing order of danger

CONTRACTS

- Contracts were awarded to four firms in January 2010
- Each contract term is three years with a possible two year extension
- Each contract is eligible for up to \$2,000,000 annually for the duration of the contract as funds are available.
- Initial assessment phase work has begun under these contracts at seven priority sites.
- Nine additional priority sites are being prepared for the initial assessment phase work.
- 2 additional contracts, started out of the hurricane money, have been extended at a cost of ~\$600,000.00

LOCAL GOVERNMENT REIMBURSEMENT

- Initial assessment phase work is being conducted for local governments under plans approved by the Pre-Regulatory Landfill Unit.
- Estimated eligible costs are \$350,000.
- If needed, contract funds may be reallocated to accommodate eligible local government reimbursement requests

LOCAL GOVERNMENT INFORMATION

- The Pre-regulatory Unit Landfill staff is providing notification to county managers and local environmental health officials of confirmed landfill site's name and address.
- Local environmental health departments are also provided information on private potable wells sampled and analyzed by this program.
- When required, health risk evaluations are completed by the toxicologist in the Inactive Hazardous Sites Branch.
- Property owners with known firing ranges on old landfills have been provided EPA's manual Best Management Practices for Lead at Outdoor Shooting Ranges and a recommendation to reclaim spent ammunition.
- Local governments will be notified of planned activities associated with priority assessment of pre-1983 landfills and relevant new site information.

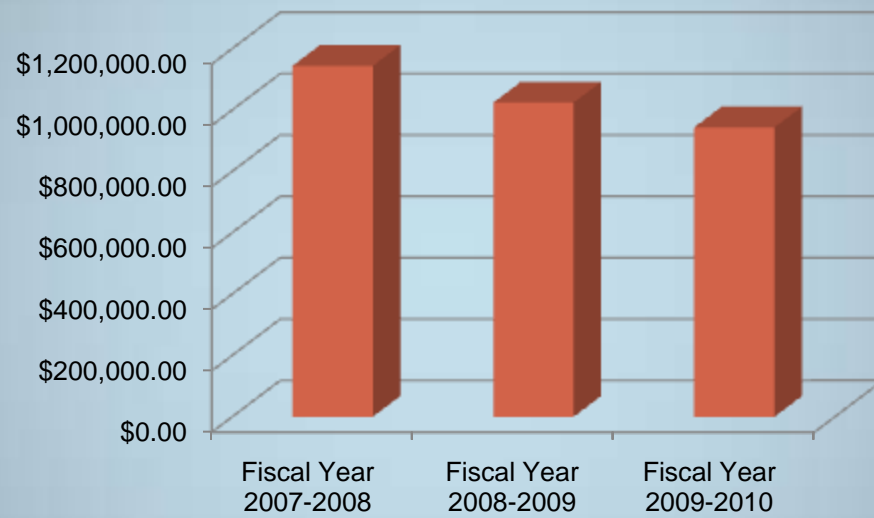
